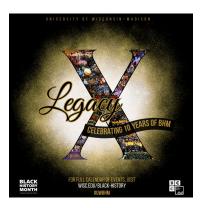

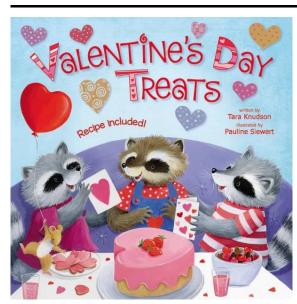

# Chef's Corner

### Strawberry Oatmeal Bars

Combine first five ingredients, then pour in melted butter and stir. Press half of the mixture into the bottom of an 8x8 pan. Scatter strawberries on top, sprinkle with cornstarch, lemon juice, and half of the sugar. Put remainder of the mixture and sugar on top. Bake 35-40 minutes at 375 degrees F.

#### Ingredients:

1 cup oats

34 cup whole wheat flour

1/₃ cup light brown sugar

1/4 teaspoon ground ginger

1/4 teaspoon salt

6 tablespoons butter

2 cups small-diced strawberries

1 teaspoon cornstarch

1 tablespoon lemon juice

1 tablespoon sugar
